Dear Skye Masson,

I have received your letter of October 19, 2010, which provides copies of Council Member Pat Berryman's expense reports.

Your letter states, "...enclosed please find copies of the requested responsive information received from Council Member Berryman."

However, I do not, repeat not, find this information to be completely responsive. Which is a great disappointment considering the fact that even after the attorney general issued an opinion in this matter on August 5, 2010, I received nothing from Council Member Berryman and the City of Georgetown until I filed complaints with the district attorney, county attorney and attorney general on September 16, 2010. Even then it took Council Member Berryman more than a month to respond.

To restate the obvious:

1. My Open Records Request No. 13 of May 17, 2010, requested expense records for the period from July 2008 through December 2009, the period for which she was paid \$13,600 by the City of Georgetown.
2. The records provided with your letter of October 19 cover the period from June 2008 through June 2009. The information for the months of July 2009 through December 2009 are not included.
3. Because no information was provided for the last six months of the period in question I find the information not to be completely responsive to my original request.

Please acknowledge receipt of this e-mail by replying to <mailto:ken@theaustinbulldog.org> and please let me know what action is being taken to provide the missing six months of expense information.
