**CORRECTION DEMAND PURSUANT TO  
TEXAS CIVIL PRACTICES AND REMEDIES CODE § 73.055**

Re: Correction demand for article regarding Don Zimmerman, titled “Candidate Lost Custody Over Abuse,” published in weblog dated October 9, 2014 at 3:10 pm, and allegedly updated on Wednesday, October 15, 2014 7:42pm.

Dear Mr. Martin,

My office represents Don Zimmerman, both individually and on behalf of Texans for Zimmerman. This letter serves as a demand for correction, under Texas Civil Practices and Remedies Code § 73.055.

You serve as “editor,” and likely are the author, of the aforementioned commentary/article on your weblog (hereinafter “blog” or “the blog”). As such, you are responsible for the content of that blog. You reference court files you found at the courthouse.

Your blog states that you update the articles and respond to readers, and also states, “in the interest of making this report the best possible fair, true, and impartial account of information contained in court records, we have updated it with additions.”

Based on that self-admitted desire you have for impartiality, this correction demand hereby informs you that the blog needs to be corrected to reflect that the allegations against Don Zimmerman are no longer reflected in the Travis County court records.

On January 20, 2017, that order referenced on your website was amended “nunc pro tunc,” an administrative correction, to properly remove any phrase that the false allegations in the petition were true. A copy of that Agreed Nunc Pro Tunc Order is attached. That it was agreed demonstrates the allegation, despite being made, was not intended to be reflected in the final order and was a clerical error rather than a legal error.

Mr. Zimmerman, after being confronted with the false allegation on your blog, makes demand for correction.

Demand is hereby made for you to link to the corrected order on your blog, and acknowledge receipt of this by Friday, October 14, 2022. Failure to act will subject you to legal action according to the appropriate law.
